



RESIDENTIAL FENCE PERMIT INFO

A PERMIT IS REQUIRED...

* To install, alter, or replace a fence.

A PERMIT APPLICATION FOR A FENCE INCLUDES...

* A completed fence permit application.

* A recent plat of survey drawn to scale showing location of fence, height and type of fence, wood aluminum, etc.

FENCES MAY BE LOCATED...

*A single fence may be erected around the perimter of the property not to exceed six feet in height.

*Front Yard Fences: Front yard fences shall be permitted provided that such fence is not closer to the front lot line than the required front yard setback

FENCES MAY NOT BE LOCATED...

*Fence Obstructions: No person shall erect, alter or relocate any fence nor plant shrubbery which limits the side drive corridor of an adjacent property to less than nine and one-half feet (9.5') in width, measured perpendicular to the side lot line. A backyard, side lot line fence, where there is a side drive on the adjacent property, shall not extend any further in a front yard direction than the rear original building line of the principal residential structure.

* Adjacent to or directly parrallel to an existing fence along a lot line that is shared with a neighbor. Unless the neighbor has submitted a signed letter allowing the removal of their existing fence. NO DOUBLE FENCES ALLOWED.

ALSO NEED TO KNOW...

* The finished side of the fence must face adjoining property or street frontage.

* Any contractor hired to complete work must be registered in the Village Of Stickney.

* All fence posts are required to be a minimum of 36" deep and will require a post hole inspection prior to placing concrete in the hole to confirm proper depth.
