BUILDING PERMITS

You will be fined if you start work without obtaining a Building Permit. NO EXCEPTIONS. A building permit must be obtained *prior* to

or repair of any house/property
whether doing the work yourself or
by a contractor. Permits are
needed for, but not limited to, the

following: alterations involving moving or adding walls, basement finish-out, electrical and plumbing work, HVAC work, shed, fence, deck, patio, roof, driveway, window replacement, siding, solar panels, swimming pool. If you're not sure if a permit is required, please call the Village Office at 708-788-3429. Some building permits require a fee, however for many projects, there is no fee at all for the permit.

Permits are required to ensure that the work adheres to Forest View Building Codes. Also permits can guarantee that a contractor is insured and bonded and the homeowner is protected from fraud.

Stickney Township Office on Aging

PUBLIC WORKS

FALLING LEAVES

When you start raking those colorful leaves, please refrain from raking them into the



street. Public Works already has a difficult time keeping the leaves that naturally fall into the street from entering sewer intake basins. As you may have noticed, when intake grates and basins become clogged, localized street flooding occurs.

For new residents, leaves are to be placed in paper yard waste bags or garbage cans with a "Compost Only" sticker affixed to it. "Compost Only" stickers are available at the Village Office at no charge. Place full bags or garbage cans at the curb for Wednesday morning pickup.

We ask for your support by not raking the leaves into the street, and when possible, to rake the leaves out of the gutters as you're cleaning your yard.

RESIDENTS WITH LAWN SERVICE:

Please make sure your landscaping company does NOT blow the leaves into the street.

Please advise your landscaper to place leaves in a garbage can with a Compost Sticker (available at the Village Office free of charge) affixed to the can or to bag the leaves in paper yard waste bags.

DOG OWNERSHIP

We would like to take this opportunity to remind all

residents that per Village Code all dogs must be licensed ANNUALLY (in the month of June each year) with the Village Office and wear an up-to-date dog identification tag. To obtain a license, owners must show proof of a current rabies vaccination. Please remember that no more than three (3) dogs are allowed per residence. If a dog in in your future plans, registration must occur within 30 days after acquiring, maintaining or harboring new dog. Failure to abide by Village Code will result in penalty for being in violation.





Once again, the Forest View Fire Department wants to make sure you have a working smoke detector AND carbon monoxide detector.


Smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors are required by law. At a minimum, we recommend detectors that have 10-year lithium batteries. Hardwired, interconnected devices are the best solution. Every house is different, but you should have both detectors on every floor of your home.

A home without working detectors could cost you your life. Why not make sure your home is safe and get some today!

FOREST VIEW MAIL. SURVEY TO BEGIN

Frank Luznicky, president of Forest View, was recently informed by Jerome Borkovec, Berwyn postmaster, that a survey will be conducted in the village during the latter part of March to determine whether or not the community is eligible for house to house mail deliveries.

At present, Forest View does not have house to house mail deliveries since the requirement for such service is that one-half of the lots within the village must be occupied, Luznicky said. The information concerning the survey was made known at the Monday meeting of the village board.

FOREST VIEW TO HAVE PLAYGROUND FOR CHILDREN

Forest View village children will have a playground and park in the near future, according to present plans. The latter has been brought up for discussion several times during the past few months, and last month it was decided to conduct a survey of the residential area. This survey has now been completed, Frank Luznicky, village president, said, and it is hoped that one of the first spring projects started will be the playground.

The survey showed that about 200 children reside in the area and a playground is inevitable, the president said. He expects the first step of purchasing approximately 1½ blocks of land in a Forest View site, as yet undetermined, will be made in the very near future.

The present plans include a twosection playground, one section to include a ball park and basketball court for the older children and the other half to be equipped with slides, sand boxes, swings, etc. for the younger children.

SCOTLAND

COCK-A LEEKIE -STEW/SOUP

This is a Scottish dish that is traditionally a thick soup.

(Leeks need to be cleaned very carefully to get all dirt/grit out)

Ingredients:

2-3 lbs chicken- I use 3 thigh/leg part of chicken which is about 3 lbs (w/skin & bone)

1-1/2 cup sliced carrots

1-1/4 cup barley (**if you use quick/instant barley, don't add until you add carrots and leeks)

6-7 cups water (+ if you want a bit thinner)

or use chicken stock and do not add bouillon*

6-7 chicken bouillon cubes (1 per cup of water)

Salt and pepper to taste


1 Leek sliced into 1" pieces (or your preference)


In large pot combine chicken, water, bouillon and salt & pepper. Bring to boil-add barley**

Reduce heat cover and simmer for 30 mins or until chicken is cooked through and no longer pink inside.

Remove chicken from pot and add leeks and carrots (and barley if instant) Bring back to boil, reduce heat, cover and simmer until carrots and leeks are cooked.

Meanwhile, skin and debone cooked chicken. Cut into pieces. Return meat to stew and cook for about 5 mins until heated through. Serve hot.

June 22, 2021

Village President Miller is requesting the boards' approval to appoint Michael C. Dropka as the Village Administrator.

Village President Miller mentioned that Rich Golf from Lakeshore Recycling did have a request during the visit. He has requested that we ask our residents to place cans or bottles in paper bags for recycling and not Jewel bags. The plastic bags become tangled in the belts of the equipment. The bags can be recycled at Jewel. We will put this information in the newsletter.

July 13, 2021

Village President Miller mentioned the resignation of Police Chief Gary Wiseman, effective June 22, 2021. Village President Miller is recommending the appointment of Marcelo Perez as Interim Chief of Police.

Interim Police Chief Perez is seeking the Boards' approval to hire three Part-Time Record Clerk/Radio Operators to expand coverage of the dispatch window service hours to a longer schedule.

Village Clerk Conklin spoke regarding a proclamation request from Operation Life Saver to promote Rail Safety Week. Resolution No. 21-06 was drafted, proclaiming that Nancy L. Miller, Village President, of the Village of Forest View does hereby attest her full support proclaiming September 20th to 26th, 2021, National Rail Safety Week and encouraging all

citizens to recognize the importance of rail safety education.

In May, the Illinois Department of Labor /OSHA issued a few citations during their visit. All citations have been abated. We are in good standing with OSHA.

Village Administrator Dropka had a very busy two weeks and mentioned "I had the opportunity to meet with many people, everyone has been wonderful. I would like to thank you for your confidence in me and I am happy to be here."

Village Administrator Dropka spoke about signing a contract with Azavar. Azavar is an audit company that audits primarily our revenues. An example is the businesses located with the Chicago address and zip code may be paying taxes to Chicago instead of Forest View. In addition to property tax, the businesses pay gas, utility, telecom and business tax in which the Village of Forest View should be receiving a percentage of.

Village President Miller and Village Administrator Dropka completed a ride-along with the Police Department. It is very amazing to witness the stops our Police Officers make and the things they find and encounter.

July 27, 2021

There was a motion to approve Ordinance No 21-05, amending section 3-19-2 "Parking Lot Tax" of the Forest View Village Code.

Village Administrator Dropka spoke regarding the push tax for video gaming establishments Ordinance 21-06.

August 10, 2021

There was a motion to appoint Midalia Nevarez as Village Trustee.

Discussion ensued regarding beautification, weed control and a future option to lay sod on the village Hall grounds. The stone and mulch are a part of phase one. In the spring, we will look into phase two, planting additional flowers and bushes to continue beautifying the Village Hall property.

On July 28, 2021, we experienced a slight water break in a service line. The break was isolated, no residents were affected and estimated water loss was minimal.

Fire Prevention Bureau updates; six inspections for August with very positive feedback from the business owners. We will be updated on the inspections.

Checking into a couple of squad cars. One squad was confirmed, once approved, we will send it to Crestwood to be outfitted. We will look into a possible grant for the second police vehicle.

August 24, 2021

Village President Miller is requesting the appointment of Laura McGuffey as the Village Clerk/Treasurer, Treasurer to the Fire & Police Pension Boards and Village Representative to the Police Pension Board.

There was a motion to appoint Mark Jones as the Fire Chief of the Forest View Fire Department.

There was a motion to approve purchasing a new 2021 Ford Explorer Interceptor Utility AWD for the Police Department.

Village Administrator Dropka sent a letter to MWRD regarding the possibility of using their truck scale to begin implementing an overweight truck ticketing program with the Police Department.

Village Administrator Dropka is working with Brad Clark on putting together a plan to televise and clean the storm and sanitary sewer and water pipes. A request for proposals will be put together by Hancock Engineering.
