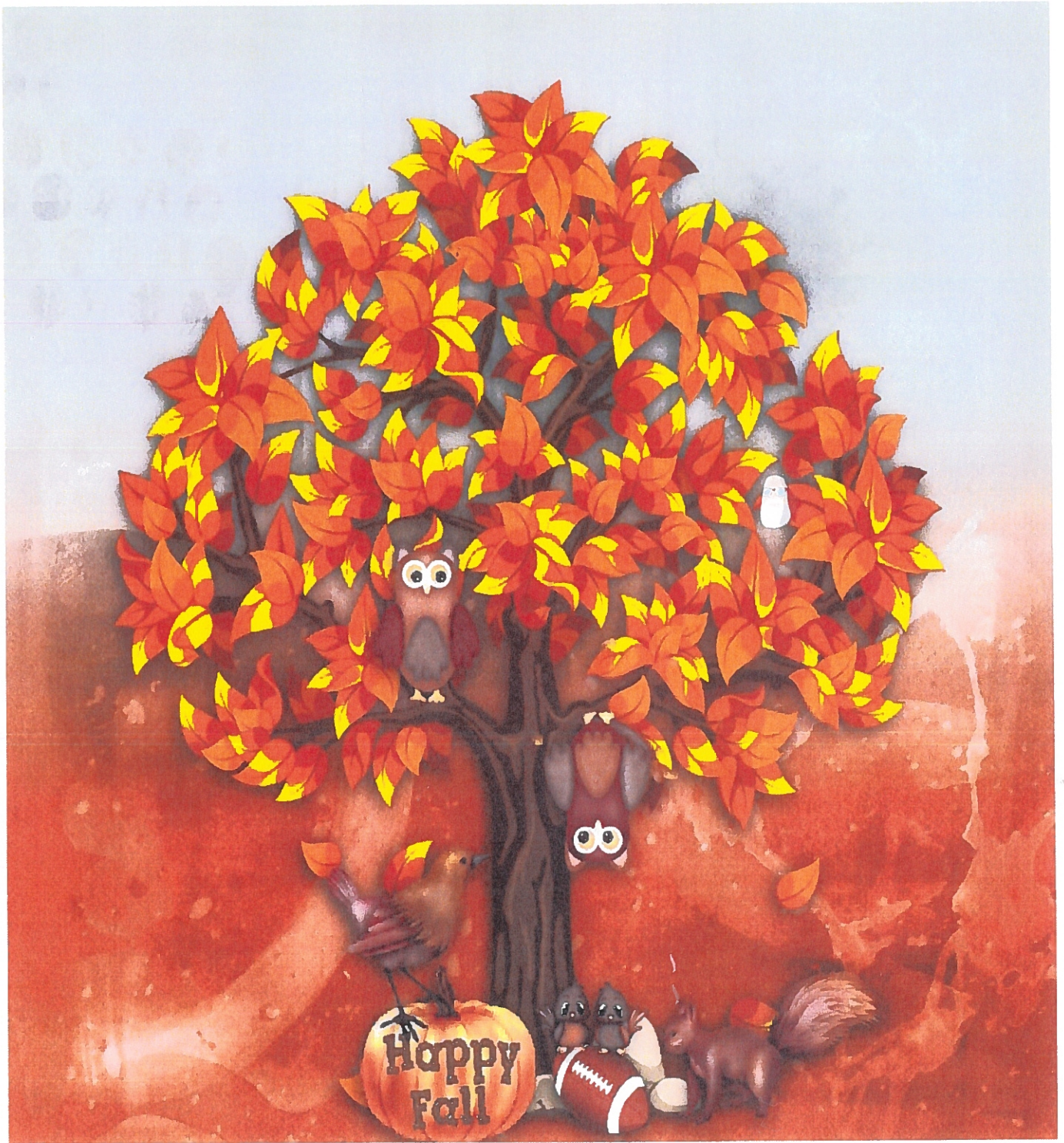
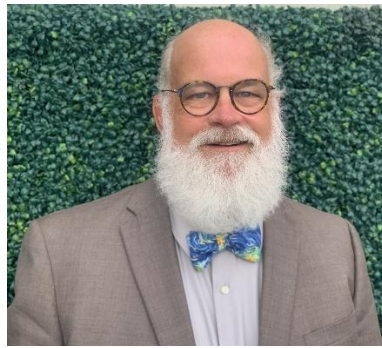

Village Administrator Melissa Wiak and Mayor David Liska recently met with U.S. Representative Jesús “Chuy” García to discuss Forest View’s top priorities and opportunities for federal and state support.

Key initiatives included:

- **Water System Upgrades – Pump House:** Pursuing \$2 million in funding to modernize the Village’s water infrastructure and ensure long-term reliability for residents and businesses.
- **Harlem Avenue Drainage Project:** Urging IDOT to advance work to expand the drain pipe along Harlem Avenue to 60 inches. Currently, the Village’s 48-inch pipe flows into a 30-inch pipe, leaving the community vulnerable to flooding until IDOT’s project is completed.
- **47th Street/Central Avenue Red-Light Camera:** Continuing advocacy for improved traffic safety at this high-volume intersection, despite IDOT’s denial of the initial proposal.
- **E-Cycling Event:** Seeking support to host district-wide electronics recycling event, giving residents safe and sustainable disposal options.
- **Veterans Memorial:** Emphasizing the need for funding to create a lasting tribute to honor Forest View’s veterans.

The Village values Congressman García’s partnership and advocacy and will continue working to secure resources that strengthen infrastructure, safety, and community pride in Forest View.



## **Mayor Liska and Administrator Wiak Tour Stickney Water Reclamation Plant**

Recently, Mayor Liska and Administrator Wiak toured the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District's (MWRD) Stickney Plant. Following recent storms, they sought to better understand how Forest View's sewer system operates. Here's what they learned:

---

### **1. What is a combined sewer?**

A combined sewer system carries both sanitary sewage and stormwater in the same pipes. Homes, businesses, and street drains connect to local sewers, which are owned and maintained by municipalities like Forest View. These local sewers flow by gravity into MWRD's larger intercepting sewers, which convey the water to reclamation plants such as Stickney for treatment.

### **2. What is a combined sewer overflow (CSO)?**

During heavy rain, when intercepting sewers or water reclamation plants reach capacity, local sewers continue to drain and can overflow into waterways.

### **3. Why do our sewers overflow into waterways?**

Forest View's sewers were designed this way more than 100 years ago—before wastewater treatment existed. They were built to carry sanitary flow and a limited amount of stormwater directly to the river. Today, they are required to handle much more flow than originally intended, which can cause capacity issues and backups.

### **4. What is the “Deep Tunnel” or TARP (Tunnel and Reservoir Plan)?**

The Tunnel and Reservoir Plan (TARP) is designed to reduce flooding and pollution from combined sewer overflows. Large tunnels capture excess sewer flow before it reaches waterways, storing it until it can be pumped to water reclamation plants. The tunnels were completed in 2006; the reservoirs are still being built.

### **5. How will the reservoirs help?**

The reservoirs provide additional storage for combined sewage during storms. Together, the three reservoirs will hold 17.5 billion gallons once fully complete. Two are operational, and McCook Reservoir is partially in service, with Stage II still under construction.

### **6. What happens if TARP is full?**

TARP is not unlimited. The tunnels can store 2.3 billion gallons, and the reservoirs will add another 15.15 billion gallons. During extreme storms, even this system can reach capacity, causing overflows into waterways as before TARP was built.

### **7. What causes sewer backups?**

Backups occur when the sewer system cannot drain water as fast as it enters. This can happen at any point in the system, including private property connections.

### **8. What is a lateral connection?**

A lateral connection is the pipe (usually 6 inches in diameter) that connects a home to the local sewer under the street. It is the homeowner's responsibility to maintain it. If it is clogged, damaged, or overwhelmed, backups can occur on private property even if the main sewer is not at capacity.

### **9. Can sewer backups affect entire neighborhoods?**

Yes. During intense storms, stormwater can enter sewers faster than they can flow to TARP or waterways, causing water to back up into streets and unprotected basements.

### **10. What can residents do to help prevent backups?**

- Hire a qualified plumber to inspect your basement and consider installing a check valve or overhead sewer.
- Disconnect downspouts from the sewer system and direct them to permeable surfaces, rain barrels, or rain gardens (while avoiding your or neighbors' foundations).
- Replace paved surfaces like driveways with pervious materials that absorb stormwater.
- Inspect and maintain your lateral connection regularly to avoid blockages or damage.

### **11. What are Forest View and the MWRD doing?**

- Regular inspection, maintenance, and cleaning of local sewers.
- Completion of McCook Reservoir Stage II, which will add 6.5 billion gallons of capacity to the 3.5 billion already available in Stage I.

I wanted to take a moment to share a little piece of Forest View history.

My grandmother kept a scrapbook full of local news articles, and one in particular stood out—a *Life* newspaper clipping from October 14, 1953. It featured a photo of a brand-new street sign being installed, with Officers Ray Kluge and Edward Horak, along with village employee Bessie Visensky, proudly standing by in front of the old Forest View Hall at 46th & Home Avenue.





Now, nearly **72 years later**, history has repeated itself in the best way.

Our **Public Works** department just completed the installation of new **Forest View street signs** throughout the village. To mark the occasion—and honor the past, we recreated that vintage photo with today's team: **Police Corporal Erik Kulaga, Chief Biana Zarate**, and myself, **Village Clerk Laura McGuffey**.

**You can recycle more than you may think, but maybe not everything that you want.**

- Pizza Boxes – Probably not. While some municipalities might accept them, ours doesn't recycle them due to the soiling that results from...pizza. Including them in your recycling may mean they will be moved to the trash and collected with other trash, or they will be a recycling materials contaminant.
- What about Egg Cartons – If they are cardboard or clear plastic, then, yes! If they are Styrofoam, then, no.
- The Cardboard Box for my new [TV, appliance, monitor, etc.] – Yes! The box is definitely recyclable – but the Styrofoam or packing peanuts inside are NOT. Please remove these, flatten the box and put the box in recycling, and the non-cardboard packing materials in the trash. Kids of all ages can have fun popping air pockets or bubble wrap before tossing them in the trash or taking them to a local grocery store for recycling!
- As a reminder, plastic bags can never go in our recycling bins -- this includes the large plastic garbage bag (or other plastic bag) used to contain the recycling materials. Doing so may result in the entire load going into the trash. Simply put rinsed-out recycling materials loose in your bin, or you can put them in a paper bag.



## PUBLIC WORKS

### Falling Leaves

When you start raking those colorful leaves, please refrain from raking them into the street. Although Public Works runs the street sweeper every week, the excess leaves blown from lawns causes blocked inlet and catch basin grates. This can lead to standing water in the curb gutters and road flooding.



For new residents, leaves are to be placed in **PAPER** yard waste bags or garbage cans with a **"Compost Only" sticker** affixed to it. **"Compost Only" stickers** are available at the Village Office at no charge. Place full bags or garbage cans at the curb for Wednesday morning pickup.

### RESIDENTS WITH LAWN SERVICE:

**Please make sure your landscaping company does NOT blow the leaves into the street.**

Please advise your landscaper to place leaves in a garbage can with a Compost Sticker (available at the Village Office free of charge) affixed to the can or to bag the leaves in paper yard waste bags or to mulch the leaves with the mower.

### Hydrant Flushing

Public Works will be flushing hydrants again this fall. We will notify via CodeRed phone alert on the days we plan to do this. Flushing hydrants is a highly recommended procedure that helps flush out stagnant water from dead-ends in the water main system. It also allows us to keep up with maintenance and ensuring all hydrants are operational. During the flushing its possible you will experience discolored (orange/red) water, or cloudy water. This is normal and will clear up by running a faucet for 5-10 mins. Limiting water use during the flushing will decrease this possibility.

## WATER DEPARTMENT

### New Emergency Cross-Connection with McCook

We are working on getting a new water main connection with the Village of McCook. Their main transmission line runs parallel to ours down 45<sup>th</sup> Street. This new connection would be used in emergency situations, such as us having a water main break on our transmission line that would require the water to be shut of to the entire town. This will also be needed during major infrastructure work on the water tower and underground reservoir at the pump station. We already have a connection with Stickney, however it is only a 6 inch connection, and we feel that is not sufficient enough to maintain pressure and flow for extended periods. This will be installed somewhere near the 45<sup>th</sup> and Oak Park Ave intersection.

### PET MANAGEMENT

Provide us the details of your pet. Once added to our database, your pet information will be available to the police department in case of lost or stolen.

If you are an At Risk Resident, or the primary contact, enter your contact information here for our records. In the event of an emergency, we will have quick access to your details.

Let's remember to turn our clocks back one hour. Changing your clocks means changing the batteries in both your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors!



The Forest View Fire Department wants to make sure you have working smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in your home.

Having working smoke and carbon monoxide detectors can save lives and we want to remind you of a few safety points.

At a minimum, we recommend having 10-year lithium batteries in your detectors. It's recommended that each floor of the house has one smoke and carbon monoxide detector.

We at the Forest View Fire Department would like to invite you to our Fire Prevent Week Open House / Cinder's Second Birthday event, Sunday, October 26<sup>th</sup> 2025 from 11:00 P.M. to 3:00 P.M. We will have firehouse tours, safety talks, food/drinks and of course a lot of fun! Blood pressure and Blood sugar checks will also be available upon request. 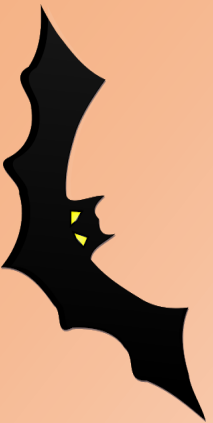

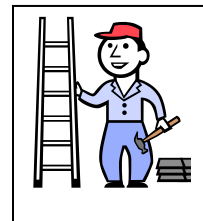
