- ✓ Make sure your photos aren't blurry or obscured.
- ✓ Double-check your address as well as the location pin on the in-survey map.

✗ Don't submit reports of non-residential structures or outbuildings (barns, carports, fences, or cars).

✗ Don't submit multiple entries for the same residence.

✗ Don't put yourself in a dangerous situation in order to take photos.

Accurately reporting the location of the damaged structure will allow emergency management to prioritize recovery efforts in the most affected areas. Use the Search Bar or Find My Location Button along the left side of the map to help locate the proper address.
