Several residents, family, friends and Village Trustee's had a BIG welcome home for him after his trip to Washington D.C. on August 24th. His entire front yard was decorated with lights, flags and posters. A group of us surprised him at the airport. There were about 15 of us waving flags and holding welcome home posters for John. He had no idea we were all going to be there.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind all residents that per Village Code all dogs must be licensed ANNUALLY (in the month of June each year) with the Village Office and wear an up-to-date dog identification tag. To obtain a license, owners must show proof of a current rabies vaccination. Please remember that no more than three (3) dogs are allowed per residence. If a dog in in your future plans, registration must occur within 30 days after acquiring, maintaining or harboring new dog. Failure to abide by Village Code will result in penalty for being in violation.

Forest View it's that time of year again to fall back! Just a reminder that Daylight Savings Time ends at 2:00 A.M. on Sunday, November the sixth. Let's remember to turn back our clocks back one hour. Changing your clocks means changing the batteries in both your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors!



The Forest View Fire Department wants to make sure you have working smoke AND carbon monoxide detectors in your home.

Having working smoke and carbon monoxide detectors can save live and we want to remind you of a few safety points.

At a minimum, we recommend having 10-year lithium batteries in your detectors. Its recommended that each floor of the house has one smoke and carbon monoxide detector.

We at the Forest View Fire Department would like to invite you to our Fire Prevent Week Open House event. Saturday, October 22nd 2022 from 2:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M. we will have firehouse tours, safety talks, food/drinks and of course a lot of fun! Blood pressure and Blood sugar checks will also be available upon request. Finally, we will have takehome bags for the kids!

PUBLIC WORKS

FALLING LEAVES

When you start raking those colorful leaves, please refrain from raking them into the

street. Although Public Works runs the street sweeper every Friday, the excess leaves blown from lawns causes blocked inlet and catch basin grates. This can lead to standing water in the curb gutters and flooding.

For new residents, leaves are to be placed in paper yard waste bags or garbage cans with a "Compost Only" sticker affixed to it. "Compost Only" stickers are available at the Village Office at no charge. Place full bags or garbage cans at the curb for Wednesday morning pickup.

We ask for your support by not raking the leaves into the street, and when possible, to rake the leaves out of the gutters as you're cleaning your yard.

RESIDENTS WITH LAWN SERVICE:

Please make sure your landscaping company does NOT blow the leaves into the street.

Please advise your landscaper to place leaves in a garbage can with a Compost Sticker (available at the Village Office free of charge) affixed to the can or to bag the leaves in paper yard waste bags.

Projects and improvement's

Water Main Improvement

In early August Benchmark Contruction Co. undertook the job of replacing over 300 feet of failing 6 inch cast iron water main. This took place between the dead ends of Clinton Ave and Kenilworth Ave. It was replaced with 8 inch High Density Polyethelyne (HDPE) pipe.

Tree trimming

Bluder tree service has been trimming locust trees throughout the summer, they will be going throughout the rest of the town later this fall to do a heavy trim on all remaining parkway trees. This allows for trees to be properly pruned and trimmed . DO NOT BE ALARMED, While the trees may look bare, proper trimming helps trees grow back in a healthy growth pattern. We will be providing a heavy trim making sure all the branches are 13-15 feet above the curb, 8 feet over the sidewalk and all crossing branches are removed. This includes any dead branches, branches touching your roof, and branches that are rubbing against one another causing an open wound with infection to possibly set in and killing a portion of the tree.

Tree Planting

Scheduled for the spring of 2023, Forest View is partnering with Openlands to provide **FREE** parkway tree planting to our residents. You can find more information in this Fall newsletter with an easy QR code attached.

Sidewalk Square Replacement

Starting September 6th, Andreas Concrete co. Will be out replacing 105 sidewalk squares that fell within the 1.5" trip and fall parameters.

We encourage citizen participation in community reforestation and beautification. The program is available to all homeowners; who are expected to assist in initial planting and care for the tree for 3 years. Trees will be placed along the frontage of the property (parkway), exact location to be determined based on space. Since grant funds are limited, applications shall be granted based on the order in which they are received, all trees are native to Illinois and will be chosen by Openlands.

'CINDERELLA' VILLAGE TO HOLD PARTY

Forest View officials, elated over the good fortune of the village when it had a \$10,000,000 assessed valuation "dumped in its lap" recently through annexation, Saturday night will hold a party for all residents of the village of some 325 persons as the start of a "Good Neighbor Week" proclaimed by Village President Frank Luznicky at the board meeting Monday night.

The party, scheduled to get under way at 8 o'clock at the village hall, 46th st. and Home ave., will be of a non-political nature and will include dancing and refreshments.

Of particular interest will be the welcoming of some 45 new residents to the village in the last couple of years to give the affair a personal touch. Residents of the annexed portion will get an especially hearty greeting.

FOREST VIEW IS 'CINDERELLA' IN ANNEXING PLAN

Village Is Now One Of Wealthiest Suburbs With 10 Million 'Legacy'

Like someone who has been left a big inheritance by an obscure relative, Forest View this week still is trying to believe that a \$10,000,000 tax assessment windfall really happened, even though the village board Monday night voted unanimously to approve the annexation of an area south of the Chicago Sanitary Canal which had been bestowed upon them without effort.

The Cinderella-like community found its "pumpkin-papered legacy coach" drawn by Douglas Wells, Clearing Industrial District vice president, who explained the situation at the "grand ball" to the trustees and an average attendance at the board meeting.

There was a delay while the whole matter was explained to the trustees and the audience, while the effects of the annexation were explained, and then came the vote which was a foregone conclusion ever since news of proposal leaked out and ran like wild fire through the estimated 320 present village residents of what is now one of the wealthiest communities for its population in the country with a \$50,000,000 assessment base.

Legal preliminaries were cleared in Cook County Court last Friday when Judge Edmund K. Jarecki signed and entered the order of the town of Stickney petitioners asking that the area be annexed to the village of Forest View.

These preliminaries had been held up for a week at the request of the Chicago Sanitary District and a representative of a trucking firm, about to construct tern, a facilities and who had been afraid that a change of political allegiance might result in re-zoning of the property.

When these objectors withdrew last Friday morning, the order was entered without more than a formal signature in court action that lasted but a few minutes.

Forest View officials were notified Monday of the official court action and the board of trustees. meeting Monday night, approved the annexation under the powers granted them in the 1942 state legislative session, which approved statutory changes in the law providing that village boards by a three-fourths vote could vote such action,

However, the confirmation of the court action doesn't become final for 30 days, a period allowed under the law to permit the filing of a referendum petition of 10 per cent of the voters which could bring the matter before the village electorate.

With the increased tax base without hardly any increase in

costs assuring the spread of taxes over the wider assessment base and a reduction of levies on village property owner, there is little likelihood of a referendum, according to Gordon Hart, 4544 Kenilworth ave., the village clerk.

Ohly hesitation at Monday night's board meeting about immediate passage of the annexation ordinance was to permit full explanation of the matter to the trustees and villagers in an effort to prove the village wasn't getting a "pig in a poke."

The audience was assured by Wells that the 21 industrial organizations maintained their own private roads and a nine-man police force, while fire-fighting facilities in the plants are supplemented by an agreement with nearby Bedford Park.

The plan for annexing the valuable industrial area to the village of Forest View was carried cut with a minimum of publicity, which normally might have attended a transfer of political sovereignity from an unincorporated to an incorporated municipality.

Village officials were not contacted after the preliminary inquiries made of Village President Frank L. Luznicky, 4527 Maple ave., when the annexation plan was first instituted, a check disclosed. Luznicky was not clear as to the exact boundaries of the proposed annexed area until it was published in The LIFE Newspapers, he said.

The annexation proposal was considered an attempt by the industries, which are part of the Clearing Industrial District, to forestall an effort by the city of Chicago to acquire the \$10,000,000 assessed valuation and bring the territory within the Chicago corporate limits which the area abuts on its southern boundary.

Forest view, one of the smallest of the western suburbs with a 1950 population of 296, had kept up a proportionate population increase with other adjoining suburbs with nearly a 50 per cent boost from its 208 population figure of 1940.

But its greatest gain has come through the location of industry

and oil company distribution facilities within its borders.

Its \$40,000,000 present assessed valuation will get a \$10,000,000 "shot in the arm" which places Forest View a one of the wealthiest suburbs for its population in the entire country.

Coupled with the valuation increase is the advantage the village stands to gain because the annexed area will present few of the problems that a similar growth elsewhere might cause.

The "residential area" of the annexed portion is confined to two homes, eliminating the necessity of building and maintaining schools, water lines, garbage collection, and other expenses which normally confront the local municipalities.

Most of the industries in the annexed portion are understood to maintain roads into their property and also to have installed the necessary public services which a municipality might otherwise provide if the area was completely platted.

The effect of the annexation will be watched with considerable interest by the village residents and neighboring communities. With a 25 per cent increase in valuation and hardly any additional expense anticipated, it is considered likely that a 20 per cent reduction of village taxes might ensue if spending is continued at the same pace.

Under the annexation proposal, the following area, all of which is within the Stickney township

limits, is included:

Starting at Harlem ave. and W. 52nd st., northeasterly along the Gulf, Mobile & Ohio right-of-way to W. 51st st. where it intersects with Sayre ave. (extension of Home ave, south of the canal), then east on 51st st. to Central ave., north on Central ave. to 47th st., east on 47th st. to Laramie ave., north on Laramie ave. to 43rd st., then west on 43rd st. to the center of the ship canal, southwesterly a'long the ship canal to Ridgeland ave., then north to the north bank of the canal, and then turning southwesterly along the north bank of the canal to Harlem ave., and south on Harlem ava. to the place of beginning.





988 Suicide Prevention Lifeline to Strengthen Mental Health Support Across Illinois.

American Rescue Plan Funding Will Support State Efforts to Transform Suicide and Mental Health Crisis Care in Illinois CHICAGO –The Illinois Department of Human Services' (IDHS) Division of Mental Health, in coordination with the federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), is expanding Illinois' mental health safety net by rolling out 988, a new, nationwide suicide prevention and mental health crisis line. The code will be available nationally beginning July 16, 2022. The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline, which has existed since 2005, is now available nationwide via a three-digit dialing code – 988 - making it easier for those in crisis to get the help they need. Converting to this easy-to-remember number offers the public increased access to potentially lifesaving, trained crisis counselors. State and federal funding have made it possible to increase staffing at Illinois' six existing 988 call centers to ensure that calls are answered in-state. The many incredible counselors answering the call to serve those in crisis, the expanded 988 Lifeline number will help save many lives. To any Illinois resident who might be struggling, know that you are not alone. We are here to support you. You can receive help by dialing or texting 988. The 988 call and text line is a crucial first step toward ensuring SAMSHA's three-part aspiration for our country: that over time, all Americans experiencing mental health crises have someone to call, someone to respond, and somewhere to go. The new code is a first step toward transforming crisis care in America, a universal entry point to needed crisis services in line with access to other emergency medical services


